Council Working to Improve School Zone Safety

Palmerston school students and parents will soon have a safer trip to school, with the commencement of Electronic Speed Limit Signs (ESLS) at local schools.

In July this year Council announced it will be investing \$100,000 to install ESLS at schools in Palmerston to alert drivers to the 40km/h speed limit during school times.

The Northern Territory Government has matched Council's commitment with an additional \$100,000 funding from its Capital Grants Program to support road crossing safety projects in Palmerston.

Experience interstate has shown that these speed signs make motorists more aware of speed, with motorists (travelling above the speed limit) reducing their speed by an average of more than 8km/hr across all sites after passing the monitors.

The following schools are the first to benefit from this initiative, with recently installed ESLS to be in operation from Monday 15 October for the start of school term four:

Bakewell Primary School, Buscall Avenue Durack Primary School, Woodlake Boulevard Moulden Park Primary School, Bonson Terrace Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School, Emery Avenue

The remaining 12 school crossings in Palmerston will have this initiative applied within 24 months. The Driver Primary School ESLS was installed last financial year.
