Palmerston Youth Festival kicks off with Geekfest Top End

The first ever Palmerston Youth Festival starts this weekend and will run until 20 July.

The popular Geekfest Top End will mark the official opening of the Festival on Saturday at 4pm in Goyder Square, with two new additions to the program this year, Boxwars and the 3D Chalk Twins.

The Festival will host nine FREE events over eight days, that celebrate art, culture, sport, music, gaming, cinema and performance arts and will include competitions and prizes that encourage youth participation and community engagement.

2019 Young Australian of the Year and award-winning hip hop artist Baker Boy will headline the free Palmy Street Party on Saturday 20 July.
